






#Key Findings

Low employment rate of university graduates in challenging circumstances



Employment rate within 12 months after graduation


28.7% of graduates from near-poor or poor household

40.3% of graduates from disadvantaged areas

45.6% of graduates from ethnic minority groups

82.0% of graduates in general

Low income level of university graduates in challenging circumstances





Two-thirds of disadvantaged graduates earned less than the average national income of university graduates:

< 7 million Vietnamese Dong (VND) per month

Graduates rely on personal networks, social networks and self-referrals as job hunting methods

The top three job-hunting methods used by disadvantaged graduates:





Lack of foreign language skills, work experience as well as the irrelevance of university curriculum were among the biggest challenges' graduates faced when finding jobs



78.4% said they lack foreign language skills




61.8% said their university degree is unhelpful




57.8% said they lack work experience

Unemployed female and male graduates faced different obstacles in finding jobs







Lack of knowledge of the labour market
